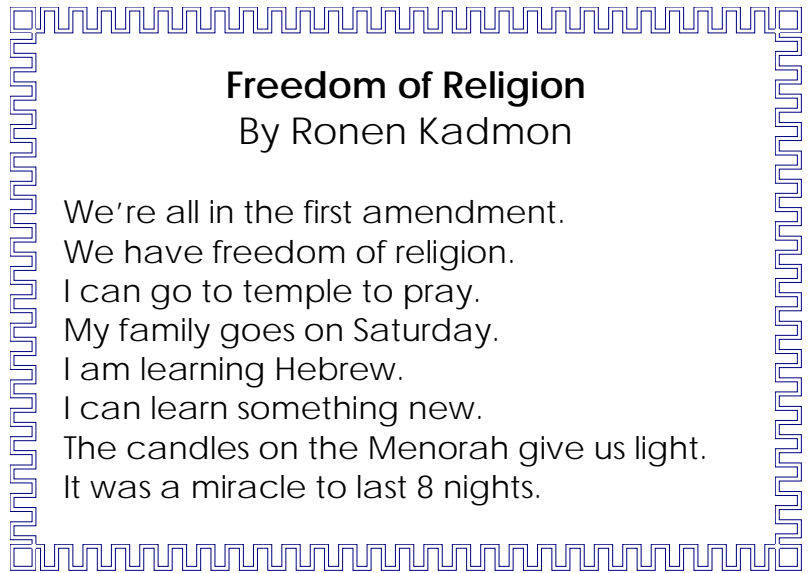




Spotlight: Fourth & Fifth Grade Poetry Project: Making History Come Alive-Expressive Social Studies

The fourth and fifth grade participated in an exciting poetry initiative with visiting poets Indigo Bethea, Kate Schapira and Elizabeth Powers Howort. The poets are affiliated with Writers in the Schools, RI. The poets worked weekly with Ms. Riojas's fifth grade classe and Mr. Baxter's fourth grade class for a ten-week period. The focus was to help the students make a connection with historical figures, events, and themes. The project enabled students to learn two things: Number one, poetry has a place in social studies; number two, poetry writing should be active and involve students in the reading of their poetry as much as possible.

Most importantly, the project emphasized literacy in the curriculum and also addressed the thematic strands of social studies. The project will provide each student with an anthology of poems written by their fellow students. **Students will read their poems at a pulic performance "Young Poets Read at AS220" on Sat., April 9, 3-5 p.m. at AS220,115 Empire Street in Providence.**

Mt. Hope Learning Center (MHLC) continues to grow with upcoming activities for students of MLK School and the community. Already serving over 100 students at MLK School and many more in the Mt. After School Programs: During its after-school program AmeriCorps volunteers engage students in enrichment activities in the form of clubs. Spring clubs include fencing, baseball, walking, photography, art, cooking, chorus, and step. It's not too late to sign up. MHLC is still enrolling students for the after-school program.
